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INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

In connection with the MAINTENANCE IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING VILLAGE OF SEA CLIFF PROMENADE RAILING— CONTRACT NO. DPW 2020-006", the Village Clerk for the Village of Sea Cliff, New York invites bids on the form attached hereto, all blanks in which must be properly filled. Bids will be received by the Village Clerk of the Village of Sea Cliff, at the Village Hall, Sea Cliff, New York until 12 Noon on Friday August 28, 2020. The Village will review all bids received and the contract awarded as soon thereafter as practicable.

A. Preparation of Proposals

In submitting bid, only the proposal sheets as furnished are to be filled out but not detached from the contract form. In no case is the contract form to be filled out or signed by the Bidder. The sealed proposals for this work shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope properly endorsed. All blank spaces for bid prices must be filled in, in ink, in both words and figures, with the gross total or gross sum for which the proposal is made. Proposals that contain any omission, erasures, alterations, additions or items not called for in the itemized proposal, or that contain irregularities of any kind may constitute sufficient cause for rejection of the bid. In case of any discrepancy in the unit price or amount bid for any item in the proposal, the unit price as expressed in words shall govern.

B. Bid Security

The proposal must be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond in an amount equal to not less than Ten percent (10 %) of the amount bid, made payable to the Village of Sea Cliff, as assurance that the bid is made in good faith. The bid bond shall be submitted in a separate envelope addressed to the Village in the same manner as the bid proposal and attached securely to the bid proposal envelope. C. Qualifications of Bidders

Forms for qualifications of the successful bidder giving evidence of sufficient facilities, equipment, experience and financial ability to insure completion of the work will be provided and the three (3) lowest bidders shall be prepared to file said form properly filled in and sworn to the office of the Village Clerk within seven (7) days after the opening of the bids.

Information contained in any statement of financial ability shall be not more than thirty (30) days old at the time of submission. If a financial statement is already on file with the Village Clerk, a new one need not be submitted provided the information contained therein is not more than thirty days old at the time of the opening of bids and provided the Contractor submits verified representation that financial condition has not materially changed since submission of said statement.

D. Rejection of Bids

The Village Clerk, Village of Sea Cliff reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted in the qualification statement or by investigation of such bidder fails to satisfy the Village Clerk of the Village of Sea Cliff that such bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work contemplated therein. Conditional bids will not be accepted. The Village Clerk reserves the right to reject any or all bids if it is deemed in the best interest of the Village, subject to approval of the Village Board.

E. Conditions of Work

Bidders are cautioned not to submit proposals until after having inspected the site of the proposed improvement and having made themselves familiar with local conditions. The attention of persons intending to make proposals is specifically called to that paragraph of the contract which debars a Contractor from pleading misunderstanding or deception because of estimates of quantities, character, location or other conditions surrounding same. Special attention is called to the notes on the plans or in the itemized proposal which are made a part of the contract and which may alter or revise the specifications.

Attention is also called to the uncertainty in the quantities of many items involved in this contract. The quantities of excavation, foundation course, etc., are especially subject to such uncertainties. Generally, the intention has been to estimate all quantities liberally.

The Vendor/Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Incorporated Village of Sea Cliff, its officers, employees, and/or agents including Newport Professional Engineering, PC from any and all liability, damage, loss, claims, demands and actions of any nature whatsoever, for any reason whatsoever, foreseeable or unforeseeable, which arises out of or is connected with, or is claimed to arise out of to be connected with, any undertaking, product, goods, merchandise, products, services sold and/or work supplied, furnished or performed by the Vendor/Contractor or its agents, liability, damages, loss, claims, attorneys and adjusting fees, demands and actions on account of personal injury, death or property loss to the Incorporated Village of Sea Cliff its officers, employees, agents or to any other persons, third parties, or property, but shall not include claims resulting from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Incorporated Village of Sea Cliff. This indemnity and hold harmless is intended to be as broad as is permitted by law and to include claims of every kind and nature – for tort, under contract; for strict liability or other liability without fault; under statute, rule, regulation or order; and otherwise.

H. Security for Faithful Performance

The successful bidder shall execute a construction bond and a labor and material payment bond each equal to one hundred (100) percent of the amount of the bid, such bonds to be executed by a surety company acceptable to the Village of Sea Cliff; or bonds secured by collateral; or securities approved by the Village of Sea Cliff. The successful bidder upon failure to execute and deliver the bond required by the proposal within seven (7) days from the date of award, as specified in the Instructions to Bidders, shall forfeit to the Village of Sea Cliff as liquidated damages for such failure or refusal, the security deposited with his bid, and he will be liable for and he agrees to pay to the Village of Sea Cliff on demand the difference between the price bid and the price for which such contract shall subsequently be relet, including the cost of such reletting less the amount of such deposit. No plea or mistake in such accepted bid shall be available to the bidder for the recovery of his deposit or as a defense to any action upon the accepted bid.

After the approval of the bonds and execution of the contract and after ten (10) percent of the work has been completed, the certified check or bid bond accompanying the proposal will be returned.

STATE LAWS

I. Foreign Contractors

Foreign contractors must comply with the provisions of Article 9A and 16 of the Tax Law, as amended, prior to submission of the proposal for the performance of the work. The certificate of the New York State Tax Commissioner to the effect that all taxes have been paid by the foreign contractor shall be conclusive proof of the payment of taxes. The term "foreign contractor" as used in this subdivision means in the case of an individual, a person who is a legal resident of another state or foreign country; in the case of a firm or co-partnership, one having one or more partners who is a legal resident of another state or foreign county; and in the case of a foreign corporation, one organized under the laws of a state other than the State of New York.

J. Lien Law

Attention of all persons making proposals is specifically called to the provisions of Section 25, Subdivision 5, Section 25A and Section 25B of the Lien Law, as amended, in relation to funds being received by a Contractor for a public improvement declared to constitute trust funds in the hands of such contractor to be applied first to the payment of certain claims.

Within five (5) days after receipt from the Engineer of notice to begin work on the job, the Contractor will furnish to the Village Clerk written notice of the names of all sub-contractors to be employed on the job and the general items of the work to be done by them and shall also, to the extent indicated in the notice to begin work, furnish written notice of the names of suppliers of materials to be used on the job. The Village Clerk may disapprove for good cause any subcontractors or material supplier selected by the Contractor and shall give written notice of its disapproval, within five (5) days after receiving the names of the subcontractor or material suppliers, to the Contractor who shall thereupon promptly notify the Village Clerk of the name of the sub-contractor or material supplier selected in replacement which shall again be subject to approval by the Village Clerk.

K. Refusal to Waive Immunity

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 103-A of the General Municipal Law, in the event that the Bidder, or any member, partner, director or officer of the Bidder, should refuse, when called before a grand jury to testify concerning any transaction or contract had with the State, any political subdivision thereof, a public authority, or with any public department, agency or official of the State or any political subdivision thereof or a public authority, to sign a waiver of immunity against subsequent criminal prosecution or to answer any relevant question concerning such transaction or contract, such person, and any firm, partnership or corporation of which he is a member, partner, director or officer shall be disqualified from thereafter selling to or submitting bids to or receiving awards from or entering into any contracts with any municipal corporation of any public department, agency or official thereof, for goods, work or services, for a period of five (5) years after such refusal, and any all contracts made with any municipal corporation or any public department, agency or official thereof on or after the first day of July, 1959 by such person, and by any firm, partnership or corporation of which he is a member, partner,

director or officer may be cancelled or terminated by the municipal corporation without incurring any penalty or damages on account of such cancellation or termination, but any monies owing by the municipal corporation for goods delivered or work done prior to the cancellation or termination shall be paid.

L. Labor Law

The Contractor and every sub-contractor performing work at the site of the project to which this contract relates shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Labor Law, as amended, of the State of New York.

Attention is called to certain provisions of the Labor Law as set forth in the contract, Article 16, which are hereby referred to and made a part hereof.

In accordance with Section 220, Subdivision 3, and 220-D of the Labor Law the following wage rates will apply:

General Provisions of Laws Covering Workers on Article 8 Public Work Contracts

Introduction

The Labor Law requires public work contractors and subcontractors to pay laborers, workers, or mechanics employed in the performance of a public work contract not less than the prevailing rate of wage and supplements (fringe benefits) in the locality where the work is performed.

Responsibilities of the Department of Jurisdiction

A Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) includes a state department, agency, board or commission: a county, city, town or village; a school district, board of education or board of cooperative educational services; a sewer, water, fire, improvement and other district corporation; a public benefit corporation; and a public authority awarding a public work contract.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) awarding a public work contract MUST obtain a Prevailing Rate Schedule listing the hourly rates of wages and supplements due the workers to be employed on a public work project. This schedule may be obtained by completing and forwarding a "Request for wage and Supplement Information" form (PW 39) to the Bureau of Public Work. The Prevailing Rate Schedule MUST be included in the specifications for the contract to be awarded and is deemed part of the public work contract.

Upon the awarding of the contract, the law requires that the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) furnish the following information to the Bureau: the name and address of the contractor, the date the contract was let and the approximate dollar value of the contract. To facilitate compliance with this provision of the Labor Law, a copy of the Department's "Notice of Contract Award" form (PW 16) is provided with the original Prevailing Rate Schedule.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) is required to notify the Bureau of the completion or cancellation of any public work project. The Department's PW 200 form is provided for that purpose.

Both the PW 16 and PW 200 forms are available for completion online.

Hours

No laborer, worker, or mechanic in the employ of a contractor or subcontractor engaged in the performance of any public work project shall be permitted to work more than eight hours in any day or more than five days in any week, except in cases of extraordinary emergency. The contractor and the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) may apply to the Bureau of Public Work for a dispensation permitting workers to work additional hours or days per week on a particular public work project.

There are very few exceptions to this rule. Complete information regarding these exceptions is available on the "Request for a dispensation to work overtime" form (PW30) and "4 Day / 10 Hour Work Schedule" form (PW 30.1).

Wages and Supplements

The wages and supplements to be paid and/or provided to laborers, workers, and mechanics employed on a public work project shall be not less than those listed in the current Prevailing Rate Schedule for the locality where the work is performed. If a prime contractor on a public work project has not been provided with a Prevailing Rate Schedule, the contractor must notify the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) who in turn must request an original Prevailing Rate Schedule form the Bureau of Public Work. Requests may be submitted by: mail to NYSDOL, Bureau of Public Work, State Office Bldg. Campus, Bldg. 12, Rm. 130, Albany, NY 12240; Fax to Bureau of Public Work (518) 485-1870; or electronically at the NYSDOL website www.labor.ny.gov.

Upon receiving the original schedule, the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) is REQUIRED to provide complete copies to all prime contractors who in turn MUST, by law, provide copies of all applicable county schedules to each subcontractor and obtain from each subcontractor, an affidavit certifying such schedules were received. If the original schedule expired, the contractor may obtain a copy of the new annual determination from the NYSDOL website www.labor.ny.gov.

The Commissioner of Labor makes an annual determination of the prevailing rates. This determination is in effect from July 1st through June 30th of the following year. The annual determination is available on the NYSDOL website www.labor.ny.gov.

Payrolls and Payroll Records

Every contractor and subcontractor MUST keep original payrolls or transcripts subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury. As per Article 6 of the Labor law, contractors and subcontractors are required to establish, maintain, and preserve for not less than six (6) years, contemperaneous, true, and accurate payroll records. At a minimum, payrolls must show the following information for each person employed on a public work project: Name, Address, Last 4 Digits of Social Security Number, Classification(s) in which the worker was employed, Hourly wage rate(s) paid, Supplements paid

or provided, and Daily and weekly number of hours worked in each classification.

The filing of payrolls to the Department of Jurisdiction is a condition of payment. Every contractor and subcontractor shall submit to the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency), within thirty (30) days after issuance of its first payroll and every thirty (30) days thereafter, a transcript of the original payrolls, subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury. The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) shall collect, review for facial validity, and maintain such payrolls.

In addition, the Commissioner of Labor may require contractors to furnish, with ten (10) days of a request, payroll records sworn to as their validity and accuracy for public work and private work. Payroll records include, but are not limited to time cards, work description sheets, proof that supplements were provided, cancelled payroll checks and payrolls. Failure to provide the requested information within the allotted ten (10) days will result in the withholding of up to 25% of the contract, not to exceed \$100,000.00. If the contractor or subcontractor does not maintain a place of business in New York State and the amount of the contract exceeds \$25,000.00, payroll records and certifications must be kept on the project worksite.

The prime contractor is responsible for any underpayments of prevailing wages or supplements by any subcontractor.

All contractors or their subcontractors shall provide to their subcontractors a copy of the Prevailing Rate Schedule specified in the public work contract as well as any subsequently issued schedules. A failure to provide these schedules by a contractor or subcontractor is a violation of Article 8, Section 220-a of the Labor Law.

All subcontractors engaged by a public work project contractor or its subcontractor, upon receipt of the original schedule and any subsequently issued schedules, shall provide to such contractor a verified statement attesting that the subcontractor has received the Prevailing Rate Schedule and will pay or provide the applicable rates of wages and supplements specified therein. (See NYS Labor Laws, Article 8. Section 220-a).

Determination of Prevailing Wage and Supplement Rate Updates Applicable to All Counties

The wages and supplements contained in the annual determination become effective July 1st whether or not the new determination has been received by a given contractor. Care should be taken to review the rates for obvious errors. Any corrections should be brought to the Department's attention immediately. It is the responsibility of the public work contractor to use the proper rates. If there is a question on the proper classification to be used, please call the district office located nearest the project. Any errors in the annual determination will be corrected and posted to the NYSDOL website on the first business day of each month. Contractors are responsible for paying these updated rates as well, retroactive to July 1st.

When you review the schedule for a particular occupation, your attention should be directed to the dates above the column of rates. These are the dates for which a given set of rates is effective. To the extent possible, the Department posts rates in its possession that cover periods of time beyond the July 1st to June 30th time frame covered by a particular annual determination. Rates that extend beyond that instant time period are informational ONLY and may be updated in future annual determinations that actually cover the then appropriate July 1st to June 30th time period.

Withholding of Payments

When a complaint is filed with the Commissioner of Labor alleging the failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay or provide the prevailing wages or supplements, or when the Commissioner of Labor believes that unpaid wages or supplements may be due, payments on the public work contract shall be withheld from the prime contractor in a sufficient amount to satisfy the alleged unpaid wages and supplements, including interest and civil penalty, pending a final determination.

When the Bureau of Public Work finds that a contractor or subcontractor on a public work project failed to pay or provide the requisite prevailing wages or supplements, the Bureau is authorized by Sections 220-b and 235.2 of the Labor Law to so notify the financial officer of the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) that awarded the public work contract. Such officer MUST then withhold or cause to be withheld from any payment due the prime contractor on account of such contract the amount indicated by the Bureau as sufficient to satisfy the unpaid wages and supplements, including interest and any civil penalty that may be assessed by the Commissioner of Labor. The withholding continues until there is a final determination of the underpayment by the Commissioner of Labor or by the court in the event a legal proceeding is instituted for review of the determination of the Commissioner of Labor.

The Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency) shall comply with this order of the Commissioner of Labor or of the court with respect to the release of the funds so withheld.

Summary of Notice Posting Requirements

The current Prevailing Rate Schedule must be posted in a prominent and accessible place on the site of the public work project. The prevailing wage schedule must be encased in, or constructed of, materials capable of withstanding adverse weather conditions and be titled "PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES" in letters no smaller than two (2) inches by two (2) inches.

The "Public Work Project" notice must be posted at the beginning of the performance of every public work contract, on each job site.

Every employer providing workers. compensation insurance and disability benefits must post notices of such coverage in the format prescribed by the Workers. Compensation Board in a conspicuous place on the jobsite.

Every employer subject to the NYS Human Rights Law must conspicuously post at its offices, places of employment, or employment training centers, notices furnished by the State Division of Human Rights.

Employers liable for contributions under the Unemployment Insurance Law must conspicuously post on the jobsite notices furnished by the NYS Department of Labor.

Apprentices

Employees cannot be paid apprentice rates unless they are individually registered in a program registered with the NYS Commissioner of Labor. The allowable ratio of apprentices to journeyworkers in any craft classification can be no greater than the statewide building trade ratios promulgated by the Department of Labor and included with the Prevailing Rate Schedule. An employee listed on a payroll as an apprentice who is not registered as above or is performing work outside the classification of work for which the apprentice is indentured, must be paid the prevailing journeyworker's wage rate for the classification of work the employee is actually performing.

NYSDOL Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-3, require that only apprentices individually registered with the NYS Department of Labor may be paid apprenticeship rates on a public work project. No other Federal or State Agency of office registers apprentices in New York State.

Persons wishing to verify the apprentice registration of any person must do so in writing by mail, to the NYSDOL Office of Employability Development / Apprenticeship Training, State Office Bldg. Campus, Bldg. 12, Albany, NY 12240 or by Fax to NYSDOL Apprenticeship Training (518) 457-7154. All requests for verification must include the name and social security number of the person for whom the information is requested.

The only conclusive proof of individual apprentice registration is written verification from the NYSDOL Apprenticeship Training Albany Central office. Neither Federal nor State Apprenticeship Training offices outside of Albany can provide conclusive registration information.

It should be noted that the existence of a registered apprenticeship program is not conclusive proof that any person is registered in that program. Furthermore, the existence or possession of wallet cards, identification cards, or copies of state forms is not conclusive proof of the registration of any person as an apprentice.

Interest and Penalties

In the event that an underpayment of wages and/or supplements is found:

- Interest shall be assessed at the rate then in effect as prescribed by the Superintendent of Banks pursuant to section 14-a of the Banking Law, per annum from the date of underpayment to the date restitution is made.
- A Civil Penalty may also be assessed, not to exceed 25% of the total of wages, supplements, and interest due.

Debarment

Any contractor or subcontractor and/or its successor shall be ineligible to submit a bid on or be awarded any public work contract or subcontract with any state, municipal corporation or public body for a period of five (5) years when:

- Two (2) willful determinations have been rendered against that contractor or subcontractor and/or its successor within any consecutive six (6) year period.
- There is any willful determination that involves the falsification of payroll records or the kickback of wages or supplements.

Criminal Sanctions

Willful violations of the Prevailing Wage Law (Article 8 of the Labor Law) may be a felony punishable by fine or imprisonment of up to 15 years, or both.

Discrimination

No employee or applicant for employment may be discriminated against on account of age, race, creed, color, national origin, sex, disability or marital status.

No contractor, subcontractor nor any person acting on its behalf, shall by reason of race, creed, color, disability, sex or national origin discriminate against any citizen of the State of New York who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(a)).

No contractor, subcontractor, nor any person acting on its behalf, shall in any manner, discriminate against or intimidate any employee on account of race, creed, color, disability, sex, or national origin (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(b)).

The Human Rights Law also prohibits discrimination in employment because of age, marital status, or religion.

There may be deducted from the amount payable to the contractor under the contract a penalty of \$50.00 for each calendar day during which such person was discriminated against or intimidated in violation of the provision of the contract (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(c)).

The contract may be cancelled or terminated by the State or municipality. All monies due or to become due thereunder may be forfeited for a second or any subsequent violation of the terms or conditions of the anti-discrimination sections of the contract (NYS Labor Law, Article 8, Section 220-e(d)).

Every employer subject to the New York State Human Rights Law must conspicuously post at its offices, places of employment, or employment training centers notices furnished by the State Division of Human Rights.

Workers' Compensation

In accordance with Section 142 of the State Finance Law, the contractor shall maintain coverage during the life of the contract for the benefit of such employees as required by the provisions of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law.

A contractor who is awarded a public work contract must provide proof of workers' compensation coverage prior to being allowed to begin work.

The insurance policy must be issued by a company authorized to provide workers' compensation coverage in New York State. Proof of coverage must be on form C-105.2 (Certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance) and must name this agency as a certificate holder.

If New York State coverage is added to an existing out-of-state policy, it can only be added to a policy from a company authorized to write workers' compensation coverage in this state. The coverage must be listed under item 3A of the information page.

The contractor must maintain proof that subcontractors doing work covered under this contract secured and maintained a workers' compensation policy for all employees working in New York State.

Every employer providing worker's compensation insurance and disability benefits must post notices of such coverage in the format prescribed by the Workers' Compensation Board in a conspicuous place on the jobsite.

Unemployment Insurance

Employers liable for contributions under the Unemployment Insurance Law must conspicuously post on the jobsite notices furnished by the New York State Department of Labor.

Social Security Numbers on Certified Payrolls:

The Department of Labor is cognizant of the concerns of the potential for misuse or inadvertent disclosure of social security numbers. Identity theft is a growing problem and we are sympathetic to contractors' concern regarding inclusion of this information on payrolls if another identifier will suffice.

For these reasons, the substitution of the use of the last four digits of the social security number on certified payrolls submitted to contracting agencies on public work projects is now acceptable to the Department of Labor. This change does not affect the Department's ability to request and receive the entire social security number from employers during its public work/ prevailing wage investigations.

Construction Industry Fair Play Act: Required Posting for Labor Law Article 25-B § 861-d

Construction industry employers must post the "Construction Industry Fair Play Act" notice in a prominent and accessible place on the job site. Failure to post the notice can result in penalties of up to \$1,500 for a first offense and up to \$5,000 for a second offense. The posting is included as part of this wage schedule. It also requires contractors and subcontractors to post a notice at the beginning of the performance of every public work contract on each job site that includes the telephone number and address for the Department of Labor and a statement informing laborers, workers or mechanics of their right to contact the Department of Labor if he/she is not receiving the proper prevailing rate of wages and/or supplements for his/her job classification. Public Work Enforcement Fund

effective date December 7, 2005

1. Purpose and Scope:

This Item describes the Public Work Enforcement Fund (the Fund, PWEF) and its relevance to State agencies and public benefit corporations engaged in construction or reconstruction contracts, maintenance and repair, and announces the recently-enacted increase to the percentage of the dollar value of such contracts that must be deposited into the Fund. This item also describes the roles of the following entities with respect to the Fund:

- New York State Department of Labor (DOL),
- The Office of the State of Comptroller (OSC), and
- State agencies and public benefit corporations.

2. Background and Statutory References:

DOL uses the Fund to enforce the State's Labor Law as it relates to contracts for construction or reconstruction, maintenance and repair, as defined in subdivision two of Section 220 of the Labor Law. State agencies and public benefit corporations participating in such contracts are required to make payments to the Fund.

Chapter 511 of the Laws of 1995 (as amended by Chapter 513 of the Laws of 1997, Chapter 655 of the Laws of 1999, Chapter 376 of the Laws of 2003 and Chapter 407 of the Laws of 2005) established the Fund.

3. Procedures and Agency Responsibilities:

The Fund is supported by transfers and deposits based on the value of contracts for construction and reconstruction, maintenance and repair, as defined in subdivision two of Section 220 of the Labor Law, into which all State agencies and public benefit corporations enter.

Chapter 407 of the Laws of 2005 increased the amount required to be provided to this fund to .10 of one-percent of the total cost of each such contract, to be calculated at the time agencies or public benefit corporations enter into a new contract or if a contract is amended. The provisions of this bill became effective August 2, 2005.

To all State Departments, Agency Heads and Public Benefit Corporations IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PUBLIC WORK ENFORCEMENT FUND

OSC will report to DOL on all construction-related ("D") contracts approved during the month, including contract amendments, and then DOL will bill agencies the appropriate assessment monthly. An agency may then make a determination if any of the billed contracts are exempt and so note on the bill submitted back to DOL. For any instance where an agency is unsure if a contract is or is not exempt, they can call the Bureau of Public Work at the number noted below for a determination. Payment by check or journal voucher is due to DOL within thirty days from the date of the billing. DOL will verify the amounts and forward them to OSC for processing.

For those contracts which are not approved or administered by the Comptroller, monthly reports and payments for deposit into the Public Work Enforcement Fund must be provided to the Administrative Finance Bureau at the DOL within 30 days of the end of each month or on a payment schedule mutually agreed upon with DOL.

Reports should contain the following information:

- Name and billing address of State agency or public benefit corporation;
- State agency or public benefit corporation contact and phone number;
- Name and address of contractor receiving the award;
- Contract number and effective dates;
- Contract amount and PWEF assessment charge (if contract amount has been amended, reflect increase or decrease to original contract and the adjustment in the PWEF charge); and
- Brief description of the work to be performed under each contract.

Required Notice under Article 25-B of the Labor Law

Attention All Employees, Contractors and Subcontractors: You are Covered by the Construction Industry Fair Play Act

The law says that you are an employee unless:

- You are free from direction and control in performing your job, and
- · You perform work that is not part of the usual work done by the business that hired you, and
- You have an independently established business.

Your employer cannot consider you to be an independent contractor unless all three of these facts apply to your work.

It is against the law for an employer to misclassify employees as independent contractors or pay employees off the books.

Employee Rights: If you are an employee, you are entitled to state and federal worker protections. These include:

- Unemployment Insurance benefits, if you are unemployed through no fault of your own, able to work, and otherwise qualified,
- Workers' compensation benefits for on-the-job injuries,
- Payment for wages earned, minimum wage, and overtime (under certain conditions),
- Prevailing wages on public work projects,
- The provisions of the National Labor Relations Act, and
- A safe work environment.

It is a violation of this law for employers to retaliate against anyone who asserts their rights under the law. Retaliation subjects an employer to civil penalties, a private lawsuit or both.

Independent Contractors: If you are an independent contractor, you must pay all taxes and Unemployment Insurance contributions required by New York State and Federal Law.

Penalties for paying workers off the books or improperly treating employees as independent contractors:

• Civil Penalty First offense: Up to \$2,500 per employee

Subsequent offense(s): Up to \$5,000 per employee

• Criminal Penalty First offense: Misdemeanor - up to 30 days in jail, up to a \$25,000 fine

and debarment from performing public work for up to one year.

Subsequent offense(s): Misdemeanor - up to 60 days in jail or up to a \$50,000 fine and debarment from performing public work for up to 5

years.

Requirements for OSHA 10 Compliance

Article 8 §220-h requires that when the advertised specifications, for every contract for public work, is \$250,000.00 or more the contract must contain a provision requiring that every worker employed in the performance of a public work contract shall be certified as having completed an OSHA 10 safety training course. The clear intent of this provision is to require that all employees of public work contractors, required to be paid prevailing rates, receive such training "prior to the performing any work on the project."

The Bureau will enforce the statute as follows:

All contractors and sub contractors must attach a copy of proof of completion of the OSHA 10 course to the first certified payroll submitted to the contracting agency and on each succeeding payroll where any new or additional employee is first listed.

Proof of completion may include but is not limited to:

- Copies of bona fide course completion card (Note: Completion cards do not have an expiration date.)
- Training roster, attendance record of other documentation from the certified trainer pending the issuance of the card.
- Other valid proof

**A certification by the employer attesting that all employees have completed such a course is not sufficient proof that the course has been completed.

WICKS

Public work projects are subject to the Wicks Law requiring separate specifications and bidding for the plumbing, heating and electrical work, when the total project's threshold is \$3 million in Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens and, Richmond counties; \$1.5 million in Nassau, Suffolk and Westchester counties; and \$500,000 in all other counties.

For projects below the monetary threshold, bidders must submit a sealed list naming each subcontractor for the plumbing, HVAC and electrical and the amount to be paid to each. The list may not be changed unless the public owner finds a legitimate construction need, including a change in specifications or costs or the use of a Project Labor Agreement (PLA), and must be open to public inspection.

Allows the state and local agencies and authorities to waive the Wicks Law and use a PLA if it will provide the best work at the lowest possible price. If a PLA is used, all contractors shall participate in apprentice training programs in the trades of work it employs that have been approved by the Department of Labor (DOL) for not less than three years. They shall also have at least one graduate in the last three years and use affirmative efforts to retain minority apprentices. PLA's would be exempt from Wicks, but deemed to be public work subject to prevailing wage enforcement.

The Commissioner of Labor shall have the power to enforce separate specification requirement s on projects, and may issue stop-bid orders against public owners for non-compliance.

Other new monetary thresholds, and similar sealed bidding for non-Wicks projects, would apply to certain public authorities including municipal housing authorities, NYC Construction Fund, Yonkers Educational Construction Fund, NYC Municipal Water Finance Authority, Buffalo Municipal Water Finance Authority, Westchester County Health Care Association, Nassau County Health Care Corp., Clifton-Fine Health Care Corp., Erie County Medical Center Corp., NYC Solid Waste Management Facilities, and the Dormitory Authority.

Contractors must pay subcontractors within a 7 days period.

Introduction to the Prevailing Rate Schedule

Information About Prevailing Rate Schedule

This information is provided to assist you in the interpretation of particular requirements for each classification of worker contained in the attached Schedule of Prevailing Rates.

Classification

It is the duty of the Commissioner of Labor to make the proper classification of workers taking into account whether the work is heavy and highway, building, sewer and water, tunnel work, or residential, and to make a determination of wages and supplements to be paid or provided. It is the responsibility of the public work contractor to use the proper rate. If there is a question on the proper classification to be used, please call the district office located nearest the project. District office locations and phone numbers are listed below.

Prevailing Wage Schedules are issued separately for "General Construction Projects" and "Residential Construction Projects" on a county-by-county basis.

General Construction Rates apply to projects such as: Buildings, Heavy & Highway, and Tunnel and Water & Sewer rates.

Residential Construction Rates generally apply to construction, reconstruction, repair, alteration, or demolition of one family, two family, row housing, or rental type units intended for residential use.

Some rates listed in the Residential Construction Rate Schedule have a very limited applicability listed along with the rate. Rates for occupations or locations not shown on the residential schedule must be obtained from the General Construction Rate Schedule. Please contact the local Bureau of Public Work office before using Residential Rate Schedules, to ensure that the project meets the required criteria.

Payrolls and Payroll Records

Contractors and subcontractors are required to establish, maintain, and preserve for not less that six (6) years, contemporaneous, true, and accurate payroll records.

Every contractor and subcontractor shall submit to the Department of Jurisdiction (Contracting Agency), within thirty (30) days after issuance of its first payroll and every thirty (30) days thereafter, a transcript of the original payrolls, subscribed and affirmed as true under penalty of perjury.

Paid Holidays

Paid Holidays are days for which an eligible employee receives a regular day's pay, but is not required to perform work. If an employee works on a day listed as a paid holiday, this remuneration is in addition to payment of the required prevailing rate for the work actually performed.

Overtime

At a minimum, all work performed on a public work project in excess of eight hours in any one day or more than five days in any workweek is overtime. However, the specific overtime requirements for each trade or occupation on a public work project may differ. Specific overtime requirements for each trade or occupation are contained in the prevailing rate schedules.

Overtime holiday pay is the premium pay that is required for work performed on specified holidays. It is only required where the employee actually performs work on such holidays.

The applicable holidays are listed under HOLIDAYS: OVERTIME. The required rate of pay for these covered holidays can be found in the OVERTIME PAY section listings for each classification.

Supplemental Benefits

Particular attention should be given to the supplemental benefit requirements. Although in most cases the payment or provision of supplements is straight time for all hours worked, some classifications require the payment or provision of supplements, or a portion of the supplements, to be paid or provided at a premium rate for premium hours worked. Supplements may also be required to be paid or provided on paid holidays, regardless of whether the day is worked. The Overtime Codes and Notes listed on the particular wage classification will indicate these conditions as required.

Effective Dates

When you review the schedule for a particular occupation, your attention should be directed to the dates above the column of rates. These are the dates for which a given set of rates is effective. The rate listed is valid until the next effective rate change or until the new annual determination which takes effect on July 1 of each year. All contractors and subcontractors are required to pay the current prevailing rates of wages and supplements. If you have any questions please contact the Bureau of Public Work or visit the New York State Department of Labor website (www.labor.ny.gov) for current wage rate information.

Apprentice Training Ratios

The following are the allowable ratios of registered Apprentices to Journey-workers.

For example, the ratio 1:1,1:3 indicates the allowable initial ratio is one Apprentice to one Journeyworker. The Journeyworker must be in place on the project before an Apprentice is allowed. Then three additional Journeyworkers are needed before a second Apprentice is allowed. The last ratio repeats indefinitely. Therefore, three more Journeyworkers must be present before a third Apprentice can be hired, and so on.

Under Article 8 and Article 9 of the NYS Labor Law, a contractor, sub-contractor and/or its successor shall be debarred and ineligible to submit a bid on or be awarded any public work or public building service contract/sub-contract with the state, any municipal corporation or public body for a period of five (5) years from the date of debarment when:

- Two (2) final determinations have been rendered within any consecutive six-year (6) period determining that such contractor, sub-contractor and/or its successor has WILLFULLY failed to pay the prevailing wage and/or supplements;
- One (1) final determination involves falsification of payroll records or the kickback of wages and/or supplements.

The agency issuing the determination and providing the information, is denoted under the heading 'Fiscal Officer'. DOL = New York State Department of Labor; NYC = New York City Comptroller's Office; AG = New York State Attorney General's Office; DA = County District Attorney's Office.

ARTICLE 1. The Contractor shall do all the work and furnish all labor, materials, equipment, tools and appliances, except as hereinafter otherwise stated, that may be necessary and proper for performing and completing the work.

The Contractor further agrees that he is fully informed regarding all of the conditions affecting the work to be done and labor and materials to be furnished for the completion of this contract and that his information was secured by personal investigation and research and not from the estimates of the Engineer, and that he will make no claim against the Village of Sea Cliff, by reason of estimates, tests or representation of any officer or agent of said Village.

ARTICLE 2. Whenever the following words appear in this contract and specifications hereto attached:

<u>Maintenance Bond:</u> A surety company bond in the form contained herein guaranteeing that the Contractor shall make all needed repairs on the Work as it progresses and guarantees all Work against defect of material or workmanship for a period of one (1) year from the date of final acceptance and shall make good to the Village at the Contractor's expense any such defects which shall appear within that period. Final acceptance shall be made on a per project basis during the course of the Contract.

ARTICLE 9. MACHINERY AND PLANT. The Contractor shall furnish at his own cost all transportation, apparatus, ways, works, machinery and plant and also suitable appliances requisite for the execution of this contract, and shall be solely answerable for the same, and for the safe, proper and lawful construction, maintenance and use thereof. The Contractor shall cover and protect the work from damage, and its injury to the same before completion of this contract and its acceptance by the Village Clerk, shall be made good by the Contractor who shall be solely answerable for all damages to the Village, to the neighboring premises, or to any private or personal property due to improper, illegal or negligent conduct of himself or his subcontractor, employees or agents in or about the said work, or in the execution of the work covered by this contract or any extra work undertaken, as hereinafter provided, or to any defect in or improper use of scaffolding, apparatus, ways, works, machinery and plant; and he shall assume the defense and save harmless the Village, its officers, or agents, from all claims whatsoever relating to labor or materials furnished for the work or to inventions, patents or patent rights used in the work or doing the work.

ARTICLE 10. PATENTED DEVICE, MATERIAL AND PROCESSES. It is mutually understood and agreed that contract prices are to include all royalties and costs arising from patents, trademarks, and copyrights in any way involved in the work. Whenever the Contractor is required

or desires to use any design, device, material or process covered by letters, patent or copyrights, the Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless the Village, from any and all claims for infringement by reason of the use of any such patented design, device, materials or process, to be performed under the contract, and shall indemnify the said Village, for any costs, expenses and damages which it may be obliged to pay, by reason of any infringement at any time during the prosecution or after the completion of the work.

ARTICLE 11. SUITS AT LAW. In case any action at law or suit in equity may or shall be brought against the Village of any of its officers or agents for or on account of the failure, omission or neglect of the Contractor, or, when authorized, his subcontractor or his employees or agents, to do or perform any of the covenants, acts, matters or things by this contract undertaken to be done or performed by the Contractor or his subcontractor, or his employees or agents, or from any injury done to property or persons and caused by negligence or alleged negligence of the Contractor or his subcontractor or his employees or agents, then the Contractor shall immediately assume and take charge of the defense of such actions or suits in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if said actions or suits had been brought directly against the Contractor, and the Contractor shall also indemnify and save harmless the Village, its officers and agents, from any and all loss, cost or damage whatever arising out of such actions or suits, in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if said actions or suits had been brought directly against the Contractor; and the Contractor shall also indemnify and save harmless the Village, its officers and agents, from any or all loss, cost of damage whatever brought as aforesaid.

ARTICLE 12. NOTICE OF ENGINEER, TIME OF START OR COMPLETION. The Contractor further agrees that he will begin work within ten (10) days after he is directed to do so by written notice from the Engineer unless the consent of the Engineer is given in writing to begin work at a later date, and that he will prosecute the same continuously in a thorough and workmanlike manner so that it shall be entirely completed and performed within 90 calendar days from the date of said notice. The Engineer shall be the sole judge as to whether the work hereunder has been completed within the time stipulated. The Contractor agrees to notify the Engineer not less than three (3) days in advance of actual operations.

ARTICLE 13. EXTENSION OF TIME. It is mutually agreed that no extension beyond the date of completion fixed by the terms of this contract shall be effective unless in writing signed by the Engineer and approved by the Village Clerk. Such extension shall be for such time and upon such terms and conditions as shall be fixed by the Village Clerk, which may include a charge for engineering and inspection expenses actually incurred upon the work. Application for such extension shall be filed by the Contractor with the Engineer at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of expiration fixed by the terms of this agreement.

ARTICLE 14. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES. It is mutually agreed between the parties that time is the essence of this contract, and that there will be, on the part of the Village, considerable monetary damage in the event of any delay in the completion of the same. For each calendar day that any work shall remain uncompleted after the contract date specified for the completion of the work provided for in the contract, the amount per calendar day specified in Schedule of Liquidated Damages, will be deducted from any money due the Contractor, not as a penalty but as liquidated damages; provided however, that due amount shall be taken of any adjustment of the contract time for completion of the work as provided for elsewhere in the specifications.

Permitting the Contractor to continue and finish the work or any part of it after the time fixed for its completion or after the date to which the time for completion may have been extended, will in no way operate as a waiver on the part of the Village any of its rights under the contract.

The Village may waive such portions of the liquidated damages as may accrue if it deems the work is in such condition as to be safe and convenient for use by the traveling public.

The assessing of liquidated damages shall be in addition to engineering charges as provided for in Article 11, Extension of Time, of these specifications.

The Village agrees that the date when such liquidated damages shall cease to accrue shall be the date of completion as certified to by the Engineer. When work is stopped by order of the Engineer during the winter, the liquidated damages will be waived for the period until work may be resumed in the following spring.

ARTICLE 15. INSURANCE

- 1. Before performing any work on the contract, the Contractor shall procure and maintain Workers Compensation Insurance in accordance with the Laws of the State of New York. Two certificates of such insurance must be furnished.
- 2. The Contractor shall also procure before commencing work at the site of the work and maintain during the life of the contract, such Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance as shall protect him and his subcontractors performing work at the site from claims for damages for bodily injury, including death, as well as from claims for damages to property damage which may arise from operations under the contract, whether such operations be by himself or by any subcontractor or anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. Public Liability limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for injuries including accidental death to any one person, and subject to the same limit for each person, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 on account of one accident. Property Damage limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00.
- 3. The Contractor must also furnish, in the name of the Village of Sea Cliff, Contingent Liability and Contingent Property Damage Insurance policies to protect the Village of Sea

Cliff against claims arising from the operations of the Contractor and his subcontractors, in the same amounts as required for Public Liability and Property Damage.

- The Contractor must furnish, in the name of the Village, Protective Liability and Property Damage Insurance policies to protect the Village against claims for property damage and for personal injuries, including accidental death, arising from the operations of the Contractor and his subcontractors, in the same amounts as required for Public Liability and Property Damage.
- 5. The Contractor must furnish, in the name of the Village, Automobile and Truck Insurance policies, in the same amounts as required for Public Liability and Property Damage, to protect the Village against liability and property damage claims arising from the operation of his vehicles.

Two certificates of all insurance must be furnished.

- 6. The Contractor shall furnish all insurance required by any agency from which he or the Village must obtain permits in order to perform the work under this contract.
- 7. The Policies shall contain a provision that modification, cancellation or non-renewal shall be effective only upon thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail to the Village Clerk's Office.

ARTICLE 16. ARREARS TO COUNTY, SECTION 2206 COUNTY CHARTER. The Contractor warrants that he is not in arrears to the County or Village, upon debt or contract, and that he is not a defaulter, as surety, Contractor or otherwise.

ARTICLE 17. WORKERS COMPENSATION LAW. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter Four Hundred and Seventy-Eight of the Laws of Nineteen Hundred Sixteen or amendments thereto, this contract shall be void and of no effect unless the party of the second part shall secure compensation for the benefit of, and keep insured during the life of this contract, such employees as are required to be insured by the provisions of Chapter Forty-One of the Laws of Nineteen Hundred Fourteen and acts amendatory thereto, known as the "Workers Compensation Law".

ARTICLE 18. LABOR LAW ARTICLE 8 AND ARTICLE 9 PROVISIONS

Attention is directed to the provisions of the Labor Law of the State of New York, applicable to the employment of Labor at the site of the project, all of which shall be conformed to by the Contractor.

PREVAILING WAGE RATES - PUBLIC WORKS AND BUILDING SERVICE CONTRACTS

The following shall apply:

- a. "Public Works" and "Building Services" Definitions
- i. Public Works Labor Law Article 8 applies to contracts for public improvements in which laborers, workers or mechanics are employed on a public works project. The wage and hours provision applies to any work performed by Contractors or

subcontractors.

- **ii.** Building Services Labor Law Article 9 applies to contracts for building service work in excess of \$1,500 with a public agency, that (i) involves the care or maintenance of an existing building, or (ii) involves the transportation of office furniture or equipment to or from such building, or (iii) involves the transportation and delivery of fossil fuel to such building, and (iv) the principal purpose of which is to furnish services through use of building service employees.
- **b. Prevailing Wage Rates** Every laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the Contractor or a subcontractor shall be paid not less than the prevailing rate of wages at the time the work is performed as provided for by the Labor Law of the State New York. A copy of the current applicable prevailing wage rates to be paid or provided is annexed to the Bid Documents. The Contractor acknowledges that the bid was based on payment of the prevailing hourly wages, and supplements in case or equivalent benefits (i.e., fringe benefits and any cash or non-cash compensation which are not wages, as defined by law) that equal or exceed the applicable prevailing wage rate(s) for the location where the work is to be performed.

It is required that the Contractor keep informed of all changes in the Prevailing Wage Rates during the Contract term that apply to classes of individuals supplied by the Contractor on any work resulting from this Contract, subject to the provisions of the Labor Law. Contractor is solely liable and must pay such required prevailing wage adjustments during the Contract term as required by law.

If the Village orders the Contractor to perform extra or additional work which may make it necessary for Contractor or any subcontractor under this Contract to employ in the performance of such work any person in a trade or occupation for which no minimum wage rate is herein specified, the Village will include in the Contract order for such extra or additional work a minimum wage rate for such trade or occupation, and insofar as such extra work or additional work is concerned, there shall be paid each employee engage in work in such trade or occupation not less than the wage rate so included.

- **c.** Public posting, Certified Payroll Records and Hours In compliance with Article 8, Section 220 of the New York State Labor Law:
- i. **Posting.** The Contractor must publicly post on the work site, in a prominent and accessible place, a legible schedule of the prevailing wage rates and supplements showing all determined minimum wage rates as specified in the Contract to be paid for the various classes of laborers, working men or mechanics employed on the work, and showing all authorized deductions, if any, from unpaid wages actually earned.
- **ii. Payroll Records.** Contractors and subcontractors must keep original payrolls or transcripts subscribed and affirmed as true under the penalties of perjury as required by law. Where Contractor or a subcontractor maintains no regular place of business in New York State and where the amount of the Contract is not in excess of \$25,000, Contractor shall keep original payrolls or verified transcripts thereof showing the hours and days worked by each laborer, workman or mechanic, the occupation at which he worked and the hourly wage rate paid, on the site of the work. Where Contractor or

subcontractor maintains a regular place of business in the State, or the amount of the contract is not in excess of \$25,000, he shall produce, within five (5) days on the site of the work and upon formal order of the Commissioner of Labor or his designated representatives, such original payrolls or verified transcripts thereof, as may be deemed necessary to adequately enforce the provisions of Article 8 of the Labor Law of the State of New York, as amended by Chapter 750 of the Laws of 1956, and as may amended from time to time.

The Village may, and on the written request of any interested person shall, require the Contractor or any subcontractor or other person performing any work contemplated by this Contract or any extra work, to file a schedule of the wages to be paid to such laborers, workmen, or mechanics; and such Contractor, subcontractor, or other person shall, within ten (10) days after the receipt of written notice of such requirement, file with the State Comptroller such schedule of wages.

Contractor and each subcontractor or other person doing, or contracting to do, the whole or any part of the work contemplated by the Contract shall pay each and every one of his employees engaged in such work or any part thereof, the full and proper wage without any deduction or kick-back whatsoever, except such deductions as are made mandatory by law.

Upon demand of the Industrial Commissioner of the State of New York, Contractor shall furnish a list of the names and addresses of all his subcontractors. Contractor and each subcontractor shall keep a list of his employees, stating whether they are citizens of the State of New York, native-born citizens or naturalized citizens and, in case of naturalization, the date thereof, and the name of the Court in which granted. In the case of any subcontractor who is not a citizen, Contractor shall maintain documentation that such person is lawfully permitted to perform the work, labor, services or material provided by the subcontractor.

The foregoing is required by Section 222 of the Labor Law of the State of New York, and if such section is not complied with in any respect, this Contract shall be void.

- iii. Statements Showing Amounts Due for Wages Before payment is made by or on behalf of the Village to the Contractor of any sum or sums due on account of this Contract or for extra work, the Contractor, and every subcontractor, shall file with the Village a statement in writing in a form satisfactory to the Village certifying to the amounts then due and owing from Contractor or subcontractor, filing such statements to any and all laborers for daily or weekly wages on account of labor performed upon the work under this Contract, setting forth therein the names of the persons whose wages are unpaid and the amount due to each respectively, which statement so filed shall be verified by the oath of Contractor or subcontractor, as the case may be, that he has read such statement subscribed by him and knows the contents thereof, and that the same is true to his own knowledge.
- iv. Records Retention Contractors and subcontractors must preserve certified transcripts for a period of three (3) years from the date of completion of work on the Contract.

v. Hours/Day's Labor - Eight (8) hours shall constitute a legal day's work for all classes of employees in New York State except those engaged in farm and domestic service unless otherwise provided by law.

No laborers, workmen or mechanics in the employ of the Contractor, subcontractor or other person doing or contracting to do all or part of the work contemplated by this Contract shall be permitted or required to work more than eight (8) hours in any one calendar day or more than five (5) calendars days in any one week except in cases of extraordinary emergency including fire, flood or danger to life or property. "Extraordinary emergency" shall be deemed to include situations in which sufficient laborers, workers and mechanics cannot be employed to carry on public work expeditiously as a result of such restrictions upon the number of hours and days of labor and the immediate commencement or prosecution or completion without undue delay of the public work is necessary in the judgment of the NYS Commissioner of Labor for the preservation of the Contract site or for the protection of the life and limb of the person using the Contract site.

ARTICLE 19 PROHIBITING DISCRIMINATION

Non-discrimination Requirements – To the extent required by Article 15 of the Executive Law (also known as the Human Rights Law) and all other State and Federal statutory and constitutional non-discrimination provisions, the Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex (including gender identity or expression), national origin, sexual orientation, military status, age, disability, predisposing genetic characteristics, marital status or domestic violence victim status, or any other protected Furthermore, in accordance with Labor Law §220-e, if this is a contract for the construction, alteration or repair of any public building or public work or for the manufacture, sale or distribution of materials, equipment or supplies, and to the extent that this Contract shall be performed within New York State, Contractor agrees that neither it nor its subcontractors shall, by reason of race, creed, color, disability, se, or national origin: (a) discriminate in hiring against any New York State citizen who is qualified and available to perform the work; or (b) discriminate against or intimidate any employee hired for the performance of work under this Contract. If this is a building service contract, as defined in Labor Law §230, then, in accordance with Labor Law §239, Contractor agrees that neither it nor its subcontractors shall by reason of race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex or disability: (a) discriminate in hiring against any New York State citizen who is qualified and available to perform the work; or (b) discriminate against or intimidate any employee hired for the performance of work under this Contract.

There may be deducted from the amount payable to Contractor by the Village under this Contract a penalty of fifty (\$50.00) dollars for each person for each calendar day during which such person was illegally discriminated against or intimidated in violation of the provisions of this Contract. This Contract may be cancelled or terminated by the Village and all monies due or to become due hereunder may be forfeited for a second or any subsequent violation of the terms or conditions of this section of the Contract.

ARTICLE 20. PRICES. The Village of Sea Cliff shall pay as set forth in this contract and the Contractor shall receive the price stipulated as full compensation for everything furnished and done by him under this contract, and for all loss or damage arising out of the nature of the work aforesaid or from the action of the elements, or from unforeseen obstructions or difficulties encountered in the prosecution of the work and for all expense incurred by or in consequence of

the discontinuance of the work herein specified, and for well and faithfully completing the work and the whole thereof as herein specified, and for making repairs to and maintaining the work in good condition until the final acceptance of the work, and in conformance with the provisions of Article 25.

ARTICLE 21. PAYMENTS. Subject to modifications and instructions contained in the "Detailed Specifications of Construction", the following procedure as to payments will be followed: On or about the first of each month the Engineer shall make an estimate of the amount and the value of the work done. Whenever the monthly estimate of the Engineer shows that the value of the work completed during the previous month exceeds one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) in amount, he shall issue a certificate for such work. The Village Clerk shall thereupon cause the amount therein to be paid to the Contractor. Such certificates shall authorize the payment of ninety-five percent (90%) of the value of the work completed.

Before any payments shall be made under this contract, the Contractor and all subcontractors performing any part of the work called for by this contract must file in the office of the Village Clerk verified statements provided for in Section 220-a of the Labor Law, as amended, certifying to the amounts then due and owing from the Contractor and subcontractor filing such statements to any and all laborers for daily or weekly wages on account of labor performed upon the work under this contract, setting forth therein the names of the persons whose wages are unpaid and the amount due to each respectively.

The Contractor must set forth in his statements the names of all his subcontractors and each subcontractor must likewise in his statement set forth the names of his subcontractors. If the Contractor or subcontractor has no subcontractor, he shall so state in his statement. If there be nothing due and owing, to any laborer for daily or weekly wages on account of labor performed upon the work under this contract, verified statements to that effect must be filed by the Contractor and all subcontractors before any payments be made under this contract.

ARTICLE 22. FINAL PAYMENT. Within fifteen (15) days after completion of the work and compliance with all the terms of this contract, and submission of satisfactory evidence of having repaired any and all damage to public or privately owned properties resulting from but not a part of the work under this contract, the Engineer shall cause a final inspection to be made for approval for all work included in this contract and shall issue a final certificate of payment to the Contractor for the work done under the contract. The Village of Sea Cliff shall, not later than thirty (30) days after the acceptance of this work, pay the Contractor the entire sum so found to be due thereunder after deductions of all previous payments and all percentages and amounts to be kept and retained under provisions of the contract. All prior estimates and payments shall be subject to correction in the final estimate and payment.

ARTICLE 23. NO ESTOPPEL. The Village shall not, nor shall any department or officer thereof be precluded or estopped by any acceptance, return, certificate or payment made or given by the Engineer or other officer, agent or employee of the Village, under any provision of this agreement, from at any time (either before or after the final completion and acceptance of the work and payment therefore pursuant to any such acceptance, return, certificate or payment) showing the true and correct amount, quality and character of the work done and materials furnished by the Contractor or any other person under this agreement, or from showing at any time that any such acceptance, return, certificate or payment is untrue and incorrect, or improperly made in any particular, or that the work and materials or any part thereof do not in fact conform to the

specifications, and the Village shall not be precluded or estopped, notwithstanding any such acceptance, return, certificate and payment in accordance therewith, from demanding and recovering from the Contractor such damages as it may sustain by reason of his failure to comply with the specifications.

ARTICLE 24. NO WAIVER OF RIGHTS. Neither the inspection by the representatives or agents of the Village of Sea Cliff nor by the Engineer, nor by any of their employees, nor any order, measurements or certificate of the Engineer nor any order of the Village Clerk for payment of money, nor any money, nor any payments for or acceptance of the whole or any part of the work by the Engineer or the Village Clerk nor any extension of time, nor any possession by the Village, or its employees, shall operate as a waiver of any provision of this contract, nor any power herein provided, nor shall any waiver of any breach of this contract be held as a waiver of any other subsequent breach. Any remedy provided in this contract shall be taken and construed as cumulative, i.e.: in addition to each and every other former suit, action or legal proceeding. The Village shall also be entitled as of right to an injunction against any breach of the provisions of this contract.

ARTICLE 25. CLAIMS AND LIABILITY. No person other than the signer of this contract, as Contractor, has any interest hereunder, and no claims shall be made or be valid and neither the Village, nor any agent thereof shall be liable, or be held to pay any money, except as hereinbefore provided. The acceptance by the Contractor of the last payment shall operate as and shall be a release to the Village, and every officer and agent thereof, from any claims and liability to the Contractor for anything done or furnished, or any act or neglect of the Contractor or of any person relating to or affecting the work. No payment, however, final or otherwise, shall operate to release the Contractor or his sureties from any obligations under this contract or the performance bond.

ARTICLE 26. **SUPERVISION.** The Contractor shall give his personal supervision to the faithful prosecution of the work and in case of his absence he shall have a competent English-speaking representative or foreman on the ground who shall follow without delay all instructions of the Engineer or his assistants in the prosecution and completion of the work and every part thereof, and be in full authority to supply men, material and labor immediately.

ARTICLE 27. SUBLET OR ASSIGN. The Contractor agrees not to assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of this contract or his right, title and interest therein or his power to execute such contract, to any other person, firm or corporation without the previous consent in writing of the Village of Sea Cliff.

ARTICLE 28. CONTRACTORS GUARANTEE AND MAINTENANCE BOND. The Contractor hereby agrees to repair any imperfections that may arise and to maintain in a manner satisfactory to the Engineer all of his work for a period of one (1) year from date of final acceptance of the contract. The Contractor also agrees, for this period, to indemnify and save harmless the Village, its officers and agents from any injury done to property or persons as a direct or alleged result of imperfections in his work and shall immediately assume and take charge of the defense of such actions or suits in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if said actions and suits had been brought directly against the Contractor.

To insure that this agreement will be carried out, the Contractor shall be required to furnish a bond of an approved surety company for not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the total amount

of the contract as shown on the final Engineer's certificate, for a one (1) year period beginning from the date of this final certificate.

ARTICLE 29 NON-COLLUSIVE BIDDING CERTIFICATION. In accordance with Section 139-d of the State Finance Law, if this Contract was awarded based upon the submission of bids, Contractor affirms, under penalty of perjury, that its bid was arrived at independently and without collusion aimed at restricting competition. Contractor further affirms that, at the time Contractor submitted its bid, an authorized and responsible person executed and delivered to the Village a non-collusive bidding certification on Contractor's behalf.

ARTICLE 30 ASSIGNMENT. The Contractor shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of the Contract or its right, title or interest therein, or its power to execute the Contract to any other person, company, firm or corporation in performance of the Contract without the prior written consent of the Village Board of Trustees upon such conditions as deemed appropriate by the Board of Trustees. Failure to obtain consent to assignment from the Village shall revoke and appul this Contract

ARTICLE 31 APPROVAL OF SUBCONTRACTORS. The Village reserves the right to reject any proposed subcontractor or supplier for bona fide reasons, which may include, but are not limited to: they are on a list of companies that the Village is prohibited from doing business with; the Village determines that the company is not qualified; the Village determines that the company is not responsible; or the company has previously provided unsatisfactory work or services to the Village.

ARTICLE 32 INDEMNIFICATION. Contractor shall be fully liable for the actions of its agents, employees, partners, subcontractors or any person performing work on the Contractor's behalf and shall fully indemnify and save harmless the Village from suits, actions, damages and costs of every named and description relating to personal injury and damage to real or personal tangible property caused by an intentional act or negligence of Contractor, agents, employees, partners, subcontractors or any person performing work on the Contractor's behalf, without limitation, provided, however, that the Contractor shall not indemnify for that portion of any claim, loss or damage arising hereunder due to the negligent act of the Village.

ARTICLE 33 SET-OFF RIGHTS. The Village shall have all of its common law, equitable and statutory rights of set-off. These rights shall include, but not be limited to, the Village's option to withhold for the purposes of set-off any moneys due to the Contractor under this Contract up to any amounts due and owing to the Village with regard to this contract, any other Contract with any Village department or agency, including any contract for a term commencing prior to the term of this Contract, plus any amounts due and owing to the Village for any other reason including, without limitation, tax delinquencies, fee delinquencies or monetary penalties relative thereto. The Village shall exercise its set-off rights in accordance with normal Village practices.

ARTICLE 34 RECORDS. The Contractor shall establish and maintain complete and accurate books, records, documents, accounts and other evidence directly pertinent to performance under this Contract (hereinafter, collectively, "the Records"). The Records must be kept for the balance of the calendar year in which they were made and for six (6) additional years thereafter. The Village and any other person or entity authorized to conduct an examination, as well as the agency or agencies involved in this Contract, shall have access to the Records during normal business hours at an office of the Contractor within the State of New York or, if no such office is available,

at a mutually agreeable and reasonable venue within the State, for the term specified above for the purposes of inspection, auditing and copying. The Village shall take reasonable steps to protect from public disclosure any of the Records which are exempt from disclosure under Section 87 of the Public Officers Law (the "Statute") provided that: (i) the Contractor shall timely inform an appropriate Village official, in writing, that said records should not be disclosed; and (ii) said records shall be sufficiently identified; and (iii) designation of said records as exempt under the Statute is reasonable. Nothing contained herein shall diminish, or in any way adversely affect, the Village's right to discovery in any pending or future litigation.

ARTICLE 35 COMPLIANCE WITH NEW YORK STATE INFORMATION SECURITY BREACH AND NOTIFICATION ACT. Contractor shall comply with the provisions of the New York State Information Security Breach and Notification Act (General Business Law §899-aa and State Technology Law §208).

ARTICLE 36 INTERNATIONAL BOYCOTT PROHIBITION. In accordance with Labor Law §220-f State Finance Law §139-h, if this Contract exceeds \$5,000, the Contractor agrees, as a material condition of the Contract, that neither the Contractor nor any substantially owned or affiliated person, firm, partnership or corporation has participated, is participating, or shall participate in an international boycott in violation of the federal Export Administration Act of 1979 (50 USC App. Sections 2401 et seq.) or regulations thereunder. If such Contractor, or any of the aforesaid affiliates of Contractor, is convicted or is otherwise found to have violated said laws or regulations upon the final determination of the United States Commerce Department or any other appropriate agency of the United States subsequent to the contract's execution, such contract, amendment or modification thereto shall be rendered forfeit and void. The Contractor shall so notify the Village within five (5) business days of such conviction, determination or disposition of appeal (2NYCRR 105.4).

ARTICLE 37 IRAN DIVESTMENT ACT. By entering into this Contract, Contractor certifies that it is not on the "Entities Determined To Be Non-Responsive Bidders/Offerers Pursuant to The New York State Iran Divestment Act of 2012" list ("Prohibited Entities List") posted on the New York State Office of General Services website at http://www.ogs.ny.gov/about/regs/docs/ListofEntities.pdf and further certifies that it will not utilize on this Contract any subcontractor that is identified on the Prohibited Entities List. Contractor agrees that should it seek to renew or extend this Contract, it must provide the same certification at the time the Contract is renewed or extended. Contractor also agrees that any proposed Assignee of the Contract will be required to certify that it is not on the Prohibited Entities List before the Village may approve a request for an assignment of this Contract.

During the term of this Contract, should the Village receive information that a person (as defined in State Finance Law §165-a) is in violation of the above certifications, the Village will review such information and offer the person an opportunity to respond. If the person fails to demonstrate that it has ceased its engagement in the investment activity which is in violation of the Iran Divestment Act of 2012 within 90 days after the determination of such violation, then the Village shall take such action as may be appropriate and provided for by law, or contract, including, but not limited to, seeking compliance, recovering damages, or declaring the Contractor in default.

The Village reserves the right to reject any request for renewal, extension, or assignment for an entity that appears on the Prohibited Entities List prior to the renewal, extension, or assignment of the Contract, and to pursue a responsibility review with Contractor should it appear on the

Prohibited Entities List hereafter.

ARTICLE 38 PROHIBITION ON PURCHASE OF TROPICAL HARDWOODS. The Contractor certifies and warrants that all wood products to be used under this Contract will be in accordance with, but not limited to, the specifications and provisions of State Finance Law §165 (Use of Tropical Hardwoods) which prohibits purchase and use of tropical hardwoods, unless specifically exempted, by the State or any governmental agency or political subdivision or public benefit corporation. Qualification for an exemption under this law will be the responsibility of the Contractor to establish to meet with the approval of the Village.

In addition, when any portion of this Contract involving the use of woods, whether supply or installation, is to be performed by any subcontractor, the prime Contractor will indicate and certify in the submitted bid proposal that the subcontractor has been informed and is in compliance with specifications and provisions regarding use of tropical hardwoods as detailed in State Finance Law §165. Any such use must meet with the approval of the Village; otherwise, the bid may not be considered responsive. Under bidder certifications, proof of qualification for exemption will be the responsibility of the Contractor to meet with the approval of the Village.

ARTICLE 39 DIESEL EMISSION REDUCTION ACT. Pursuant to N.Y. Environmental Conservation Law §19-0323 of the ("the Law") it is a requirement that heavy duty diesel vehicles in excess of 8,500 pounds use the best available retrofit technology ("BART") and ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel ("ULSD"). The requirement of the Law applies to all vehicles owned, operated by or on behalf of, or leased by State agencies and State or regional public authorities. It also requires that such vehicles owned, operated by or on behalf of, or leased by State agencies and State or regional public authorities with more than half of its governing body appointed by the Governor utilize BART.

The Law may be applicable to vehicles used by contract vendors "on behalf of" State agencies and public authorities and require certain reports from contract vendors. All heavy duty diesel vehicles must have BART by December 31, 2015 (unless further extended by Law). The Law also provides a list of exempted vehicles. Regulations set forth in 6 NYCRR Parts 248 and 249 provide further guidance. By signing this Contract, the Contractor hereby certifies and warrants that all heavy duty vehicles, as defined in NYECL §19-0323, to be used under this Contract, will comply with the specifications and provisions of NYECL §19-0323, and 6 NYCRR Parts 248 and 249.

ARTICLE 40 MACBRIDE FAIR EMPLOYMENT PRINCIPLE. In accordance with the MacBride Fair Employment Principles (Chapter 807 of the Laws of 1992), the Contractor hereby stipulates that the Contractor either (a) has no business operations in Northern Ireland, or (b) shall take lawful steps in good faith to conduct any business operations in Northern Ireland in accordance with the MacBride Fair Employment Principles, and shall permit independent monitoring of compliance with such principles.

ARTICLE 41. Upon the faithful performance of the work herein embraced as set forth in the contract, and its acceptance by the Engineer, the Village of Sea Cliff hereby agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to receive the prices stipulated in the proposal as full compensation for work done under the contract.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Whenever the following words and expressions are used in these specifications, it is understood that they have the meaning defined below.

<u>COUNTY</u> - The word "County" or pronoun used in place thereof shall mean the County of Nassau, represented by the County Executive or his official agent or agents.

<u>VILLAGE</u> - The word "Village" or pronoun used in place thereof shall mean the Village of Sea Cliff and shall be deemed to include the officer or officers of the Village participating herein.

<u>VILLAGE CLERK</u> - The word "Village Clerk" or pronoun used in place thereof shall mean the Village Clerk of the Village of Sea Cliff.

<u>VILLAGE PROJECT MANAGER</u> – The Words "Village Project Manager" or pronoun used in place thereof shall mean the Project Manager of the Village of Sea Cliff, acting directly on behalf of the Village and may assume certain activities noted as "Engineer" within these specifications.

<u>CONTRACTOR</u> - The word "Contractor" or pronoun used in place thereof shall mean the party of the second part of this Agreement, and shall apply thereto regardless of number of gender.

ENGINEER - The word "Engineer" or pronoun used in place thereof shall mean the Engineer of the Village of Sea Cliff, acting directly or through authorized agent or agents.

<u>CONTRACT</u> - The Agreement covering the performance of the work. It shall include the Notice to Bidders, Instructions to Bidders, Proposal, Plans and Specifications, and will be held to cover any and all work, labor, implements and materials and other incidentals that could reasonably be required to properly and satisfactorily complete the work indicated. Work shown on the plans and not mentioned in the specifications or vice versa shall be done the same as if shown by both, and in case of conflict the Village Clerk will determine which shall govern.

<u>PLANS</u> - All official drawings or reproductions of drawings, pertaining to the work or to any structure connected therewith endorsed by the Engineer for the Village of Sea Cliff and the Village Clerk.

<u>SPECIFICATIONS - The</u> body of directions, requirements, descriptions, etc., contained in this document, together with all documents of any description, and agreements made (or to be made), pertaining to the methods or manner of performing the work and/or the quantities and quality of materials to be furnished and accepted under this contract.

<u>MATERIALS</u> - Any approved material acceptable to the Engineer and conforming to the requirements of these specifications. All processes and materials shall at all times be open to inspection by authorized representatives of the Village of Sea Cliff.

WORK - Labor and materials necessary for proper completion of the contract.

STANDARDS OF WORK

The Contractor shall be held liable for the restoration to its former condition any disturbed Village property that may be damaged during the construction of this contract.

STANDARDS OF WORKMANSHIP

The apparent silence of the specifications as to any detail or the apparent omission from them of a detailed description concerning any work to be done and materials to be furnished shall be regarded as meaning that only the best general practice observed in the latest current construction work is to prevail and that only material and workmanship of first quality is to be used in this connection, and all interpretations of these specifications shall be made upon this basis.

Any material which is rejected because of failure to meet the required tests or that has been damaged so as to cause rejection shall immediately be removed from the site of the work.

All work shall be neatly cleaned up on completion according to the Engineer's directions, and be left in a neat and orderly condition. All work shall be in a first-class and satisfactory condition at the acceptance of the contract.

PROTECTION OF UTILITIES

The Contractor shall familiarize himself with the existence of structures of municipal and other public service corporations on the site of the work and give reasonable opportunity to and cooperation with the owners of these utilities in the work of reconstructing or altering them. Such reconstruction and alteration shall be so conducted as to delay or interfere as little as practicable with the work of the Contractor. Any additional cost of various items of work because of these utilities shall be included in the price bid for these items.

The Engineer shall direct the public utility corporation to shift or remove those utility structures that may be necessary to permit the Contractor to carry out the work in accordance with the plans. The Contractor shall not remove or cause to be removed any structure or part of a structure owned by a public utility corporation without the approval of the Engineer.

The Contractor shall cooperate with the public utility corporation whose structures (aerial, surface or subsurface) are within the limits of or along the outside of the right-of-way, to make it possible for them to maintain uninterrupted service. The Contractor shall conduct his operations in such a way as to delay or interfere as little as practicable with the work of the utility corporation.

Trench excavation shall not be started until all gas mains, water mains and other service mains have been located and flagged by a utility inspector or Engineer. A gas inspector shall be available on this project at all times whenever excavations are in close proximity to gas mains and/or service lines.

Any existing underground utilities, and any utility structures including individual house services, in the bed of any proposed sewers or interfering with any proposed underground structure, shall, unless otherwise specified, be readjusted by the supplying utility corporation. The Village shall, whenever possible, adjust their alignment of storm drains and/or structures in order to expedite the contract and to prevent unnecessary hardship and/or expense to any utility corporation. The Contractor shall notify and

give sufficient notice to these corporations of the starting date of a contract in order that necessary clearances and/or removals can be made.

The Contractor shall give the particular utility corporations involved reasonable notice in advance of operations which will affect their structure and in no case shall be less than forty-eight (48) hours notice to the nearest office of the utility corporations involved. This is to be considered reasonable notice for such operations as blasting and excavating in the vicinity of their structures.

START OF PROGRESS OF THE WORK

The Contractor, or his authorized representative, and the Engineer, shall meet for the purpose of establishing a point of beginning of the work and to formulate a schedule of progressive operations. Such schedule shall be submitted by the Contractor to the Engineer, and no deviation therefrom shall be made without his consent.

CONTRACTOR TO GIVE PERSONAL ATTENTION

The Contractor shall give his constant personal attention to the work while it is in progress, or he shall place it in charge of a competent and reliable English speaking superintendent acceptable to the Engineer, who shall have the authority to act for the Contractor. The Contractor shall, at all times, employ labor and equipment which, in the opinion of the Engineer, shall be sufficient to prosecute the several classes of work to full completion in the manner and time specified.

ORDERS TO FOREMAN

Whenever the Contractor or Superintendent is not present on any part of the work where it may be desired to give directions, orders will be given by the Engineer or his representative and shall be received and obeyed by the foreman who may have charge of the particular work in reference to which the orders are given. All foremen shall be English speaking.

NO INTERFERENCE WITH TRAFFIC

The Contractor shall conduct his work so as to interfere with local traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, as little as possible. Traffic originating on or having business along the section of the road under contract shall be provided with a passable and adequate road. Fire hydrants must be kept reasonably accessible.

To accomplish this may necessitate the bridging over or the construction of structures in sections, or the providing of short detours around them and the grading and paving of one-half (I/2) of the roadway at a time. The work shall be progressed in such a manner that access to private or business driveways adjacent to the improvement will be interfered with as little as possible. Where feasible, bridging over the trenches of completed work or other acceptable methods shall be used for this purpose. The Contractor shall furnish adequate warning signs, flags, lights, paths, railings, barricades, watchmen and signal men where necessary. The Contractor is cautioned to familiarize himself with these conditions as no direct payment shall be made for this work unless specifically itemized in the contract.

CLOSING OF HIGHWAY

Where possible and as directed by the Village Clerk or other authorities having proper jurisdiction, heavy through traffic shall be detoured as hereinafter specified. Generally, through traffic will be prohibited. If,

however, the section of road under contract is located so that this becomes impracticable, then the general foregoing provisions for "No Interference with Traffic" shall apply.

DETOURING OF TRAFFIC

If the road is to be closed to through traffic, a proper detour shall be established as indicated on the plans or as directed by the Engineer. The Contractor shall erect suitable barricades and detour signs to adequately outline the direction of traffic. He shall erect suitable signs at the beginning and end of the detours to adequately warn the traveling public that the road is closed and indicate the direction of the detour. Such signs shall be illuminated and all intermediate detour signs shall be placed in such a position as to be legible at all times. This work shall be done at his own expense.

MANUFACTURED ARTICLES

In these specifications and the accompanying plans there are specified certain pieces of equipment which are deemed most suitable for the service required. It is, however, not the purpose of these specifications to eliminate other equipment and material equally as good and efficient. The Contractor will prepare their bid on the particular material and equipment specified and shall state the name of the manufacturer. But after the contract is awarded, if he decides that he would like to use some other make of machinery, equipment or material, he shall submit to the Engineer a formal request for such change.

To receive consideration, request for substitution must be accompanied by documentary proof of the actual difference in cost to the Contractor in the shape of certified copies of equipment, company's quotation to the Contractor, covering the original equipment and also equipment proposed for substitution or other proof satisfactory to the Engineer.

It is the intention that the Owner shall receive the full benefit of the saving in cost involved in any substitution, and shall be credited with such saving.

In all cases, the burden of proof that the equipment offered for substitution is equal or superior in construction and efficiency to that named in the contract shall rest on the Contractor, and unless the proof is satisfactory to the Engineer, the substitution will not be approved. Requests for substitution on the ground that better delivery can be obtained on the equipment proposed for substitution will not be approved, for it will be considered that the Contractor in his proposal has named equipment on which he has received a proposal from equipment manufacturer, giving a delivery time which will permit completion of the project within the contract time. Requests for substitution of equipment which the Contractor cannot prove to the satisfaction of the Engineer to be equal or superior in construction and efficiency to that named in the Contract, will not be approved. The determination as to whether or not such change will be permitted rests solely with the Engineer.

Should the Contractor offer and the Engineer accept any equipment or material other than that shown on the plans, or provided in these specifications, the Contractor shall prepare new design drawings to accommodate the material or equipment substituted and shall submit the same to the Engineer with complete design data for his approval.

All structural dimensions applying to equipment as shown on the plans are from preliminary drawings of the manufacturers. When equipment has been ordered by the Contractor and final certified drawings are received, any changes in dimensions or sizes shall be made by the Contractor without extra cost.

INSPECTION, REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT OF UNSATISFACTORY WORK

Wherever and whenever the Village, by its Village Clerk, shall consider it necessary to remove any portion, part or parts of the work executed under contract for inspection or other purposes, no payment shall be made for such removal or for replacement of the work to satisfactory condition in case such inspection shows the work was not constructed in accordance with the terms of the contract; nor shall payment be made for the removal or replacement of any work adjacent to or surrounded by work that has been condemned, which may in itself be of satisfactory nature, but the removal of which is made necessary for the replacement of the work that has been condemned. Concrete foundation for pavement or cement concrete pavement rejected as a result of core tests shall be removed and replaced entirely at the expense of the Contractor.

PAYMENT FOR REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT OF SATISFACTORY WORK

Where inspection shows that the work necessary to be removed was constructed in accordance with the terms of the contract, payment for removal shall be made at contract price for the removal of the specified items; if not so itemized under the contract, then the provisions of ARTICLE 4 of the contract shall apply. Replacement in such cases when ordered shall also be paid for at contract prices, except where salvage of some of the materials may warrant its reincorporation in the work, in which case a reduction in the itemized contract price for the quantity involved shall be agreed upon.

REJECTED MATERIAL

Any material which is rejected because of failure to meet the required tests or that has been damaged so as to cause rejection shall immediately be removed from the site of the work.

CLEANING UP

All work shall be neatly cleaned up on completion according to the Engineer's directions, and be left in a neat and orderly condition. All work shall be in a first class and satisfactory condition at the time of the acceptance of the contract.

EQUIVALENTS

The mention of apparatus, articles, or materials by trade name, and such specific description of same as is made, is intended to convey to the Contractor's understanding the degree of excellence required. An article of material which will conform substantially to the standard of excellence established and having an equivalent merit, strength, durability and appearance to perform the required functions, is deemed to be eligible for offer.

DATE OF COMPLETION AND CLOSING

All work under this contract is to be completed within the time indicated in the contract agreement or as extended by the Village. If in the meantime, it should become necessary, because of the lateness of the season or any other reason, to stop the work the Contractor shall at his own expense open proper drainage ditches, erect temporary structures where necessary, prepare the road so there will be minimum interference with traffic, set up and maintain a competent organization, as directed by the Village Clerk, to keep the highway in first-class condition for traffic and take every precaution to prevent any damage or unreasonable deterioration of the work during the time it is closed.

FINAL PAYMENT

Before final payment will be approved, the Contractor shall clean all construction areas free from accumulated debris. Final inspection shall reveal the premises or construction area to be in former condition. Application for final payment shall not be processed until the above requirements have been completed. Upon approval for final payment, the Contractor shall include with his final estimate a maintenance bond in the minimum sum of the work contracted for, for a period of one (1) year from the date of final approval. Maintenance and performance bonds combined will not be allowed.

General Specifications

1. Proposal

A. Where the proposal shows a minimum allowable bid price (**), the Contractor shall bid a price that is neither less than that price printed in the proposal nor more than 150% of that price printed in the proposal (i.e. where the minimum allowable price is indicated as \$100.00, the maximum allowable price is \$150.00).

Failure to comply with the above pricing requirements will result in the following action by the Village: Where the price bid is less than the minimum allowable, it will be corrected to the minimum allowable. Where the price bid exceeds the maximum allowable, it will be corrected to the maximum allowable. These corrected prices will be used for the computation of the total amount bid.

- **B.** Where the proposal shows a contingency item (*), the Village reserves the right to increase or decrease and/or omit all or any part of the quantity. No adjustment in the contract unit price will be allowed by reason of such increase or decrease.
- C. Where the proposal shows a fixed bid amount (***), the Contractor shall include that price as the amount bid. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in an adjustment of the Contractor's amount bid to reflect the fixed amount. This corrected price will be used for the computation of the total amount bid.

2. Standards of Workmanship and Materials

- **A.** All work performed and materials supplied under this Contract shall equal or exceed the requirements of this specification and the following:
 - 1) CONTRACT SPECIFICATIONS: County of Nassau Department of Public Works 1964 Standard Specifications for the Construction of Highways and Bridges.
 - 2) Ordinances of the Village of Sea Cliff.
 - 3) Requirements of Utility Companies having jurisdiction.
 - 4) The requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (OSHA).

It should be noted that certain pay items in the contract refer to other payment items for standards of workmanship, methods, quality of materials, etc. No additional payment will be

made by reason of such reference. The cost of the work or materials referred to shall be included in the prices bid.

3. Procedures

Village of Sea Cliff

- **A.** These specifications do not include all the necessary components for construction safety. It is the Contractor's responsibility to provide all construction safety measures at his own expense where not included as an integral part of a pay item.
- B. The safety provisions in the specification are primarily to protect Village property and the public against unsafe acts of the Contractor. The Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 requires that the employer: (1) shall furnish to each of his employees employment and place of employment which are free from recognized hazards that are causing or likely to cause death or serious physical harm to his employees; (2) shall comply with the Occupational Safety and Health Standards promulgated under this Act...The regulations in the Act may be more stringent than are required by the plans and/or specifications. The Contractor, however, must conform to the O.S.H.A. regulations and such conformance shall not be reason to demand additional payment or claim extra work. Sheeting shall conform strictly to the requirements of the O.S.H.A. regulations for Construction Title 28 CFR, Part 1926, Subpart P, Excavation; Sections 1926.650, 1926.651, and 1926.652. Unless otherwise shown on the plans, and where conditions permit, a self-supporting movable shield of metal may be used and moved ahead as the excavation and construction progresses. The protection afforded by such a shield shall be equal in all respects to the sheeting and shoring set forth in Title 29 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1926, Subpart P of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Regulations for Construction, and Item 10A of the CONTRACT SPECIFICATIONS.
- **C.** All work performed under this Contract shall comply with the requirements of the Industrial Code of the State of New York, Rule No. 23 and Rule No. 53, both as currently amended.
- D. The Contractor shall be held responsible for any damage to, and shall exercise extreme caution while working near utilities. Utility companies will provide shoring and bracing of their aerial structures and appurtenances, except where a specific item is provided or specified in the contract.

4. Notice to Engineer

The Contractor will be required to give the Engineer at least forty-eight (48) hours notice before beginning construction.

5. Temporary Facilities

A. The Contractor shall provide and maintain in a neat sanitary condition such accommodations for the use of his employees, the Engineer and his representatives, as may be necessary to comply with the requirements and regulations of the State and County Boards of Health, the Department of Labor Industrial Code - Rule No. 23, or of other authorities having jurisdiction, and shall commit, or permit, no public nuisance. Such accommodations shall be provided before the start of any construction work, and shall be maintained until the completion of all construction work required by the contract.

- **B.** When the Contractor has completed all construction work required by the contract, he shall remove all temporary facilities and restore all areas used for such temporary facilities to their original condition. This must be done before the final estimate is approved for payment.
- **C.** All costs associated with furnishing, maintaining and removing all temporary facilities, including land rental and other fees and charges, are to be included in the prices bid for the various contract items.

6. Emergency Telephone Numbers

- **A.** In order to facilitate the contacting of the Contractor's personnel in the event of emergency calls during other than normal working hours, the Contractor shall submit to the Engineer the names and phone numbers of three (3) persons having authority to act for the Contractor. This submission shall be made prior to the commencement of any work under this contract.
- **B.** When the Contractor or any of the three (3) persons designated to act for him has been notified that an emergency condition exists, appropriate action shall immediately be taken by the Contractor to rectify said emergency condition. Failure of the Contractor to commence the work of rectifying said emergency condition within three (3) hours after being notified releases the Village to correct said emergency condition and charge the Contractor for whatever costs the Village incurs.

7. Photographs

Before starting work, it is recommended that the Contractor take photographs, in the presence of the Engineer, of the condition of all surrounding structures. The cost of such photographs and other incidentals shall be included in the prices bid for the items in the proposal. Should the Contractor not take the recommended photographs, he shall have no claim for extra work that is required due to apparent negligence on his part. Should photographs be taken prior to beginning the work, and the Contractor can prove that the damage existed prior to construction, the Contractor will not be held liable to repair the damage.

8. Material Invoices

All deliveries of materials to the job site shall be accompanied by an extra copy of the material delivery ticket, which shall be given to the Engineer as his copy. Refusal to yield such delivery ticket to the Engineer may result in rejection of the materials.

9. Excess Materials

All excess materials shall be legally disposed of by the Contractor at his own expense.

10. Concrete Demolition and Removal

The method used for the demolition and removal of concrete will be subject to the approval of the Engineer. All broken concrete shall be removed from within the contract limits the same day it is demolished.

11. Concrete

- A. All concrete for use on this contract shall meet all of the latest requirements of the Nassau County Department of Public Works 1964 Standard Specifications for the Construction of Highways and Bridges Part 3 General Specifications, Section A Portland Cement Concrete, Class A. Additionally each delivery ticket shall include the computer print-out for the specific batch or batches of concrete. The computer print-out shall include the moisture content of the aggregates provided.
- **B.** The Contractor shall submit the concrete mix design for the Engineer's review. This mix design shall be submitted on the form provided with the details.
- **C.** It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to notify the Laboratory before 3:00 PM each day prior to planned placement of concrete. Laboratory identification with telephone number and contact person will be supplied to the Contractor at the pre-construction meeting.
- **D.** All details, calling for specific concrete strengths, shall have those requirements met.
- E. All exposed concrete shall be cured with "Tri-Kote 18 Crect" as manufactured and distributed by TK Products, located in Hillsboro, Minnesota, or an approved equal. The compound shall meet the requirements of ASTM C-309 and shall be furnished and applied in strict accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. The rate of application shall be as recommended by the manufacturer.
- **F.** In the event the 28-day break cylinder does not meet the specifications, the Contractor will be provided an opportunity to core in-place samples at his expense. All costs, including engineering, will be borne by the Contractor whether the cores pass or fail.

12. Unsatisfactory Work

The Village reserves the right to accept work which is not within reasonably close conformance with the plans and specifications, providing a credit is given to the Village by the Contractor to fully compensate the Village for anticipated future damages which may result from acceptance of such substandard work. The amount of damages shall be determined by the Village Clerk, and his decision shall be final. This deduction shall be made in accordance with Article 19 of the Agreement. The Contractor may elect not to give the Village the credit as determined by the Village Clerk, in which case the substandard work shall be completely removed by the Contractor and replaced as required on Page 36 of the Contract Specifications under the paragraph entitled Inspection, Removal and Replacement of Unsatisfactory Work.

13. Sequence of Work

A. The Contractor shall schedule his operations during the construction work on this project to conform to an approved progress schedule. Any variation from this sequence shall result in the Engineer withholding further construction grades or stopping all work until the Contractor resumes work in the required sequence. The Contractor shall have no claim for additional compensation due to lost time, etc., because of his failure to comply with this requirement.

Deviations from this sequence of work due to field conditions shall not be made without written approval of the Engineer.

B. Before starting work on this contract, the Contractor shall submit to the Engineer for approval, plans for the maintenance of traffic. This plan, after being approved, shall not be modified in any way without written approval of the Engineer.

14. Accuracy of Specifications

The specifications for the Contract have been prepared with care and are intended to show as clearly as is practicable the work required to be done. The Contractor must realize, however, that construction details cannot always be accurately anticipated and that in executing the work, field conditions may require reasonable modifications in the details of plans and quantities of work involved. Work under all items in the Contract must be carried out to meet these field conditions to the satisfaction of the Engineer and in accordance with his instructions and the Contract specifications.

17. Scope of Work

The work to be performed under this Contract shall be as indicated on the Typical Section or Sections and the Details unless otherwise directed by the Engineer.

18. Contractor's Liability (Hold Harmless)

Hold Harmless: It is expressly understood that the Contractor shall defend, and save harmless the Village of Sea Cliff, the Engineer, their agents, and employees, from all claims, suits, actions, damages, and costs, of every name and description, arising out of the performance of this Contract or from any defective condition of the materials furnished it or supplied or contemplated to be furnished or supplied under the Contract.

19. Insurance

The Contractor agrees to procure and maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the Laws of the State of New York, Comprehensive General Liability Insurance (with completed operations, plus X.C.U. when applicable), and Automobile Liability Insurance in the amount specified in the Agreement. Said policies shall contain assurance of the existence of contractual coverage defending, indemnifying, and holding harmless the Village of Sea Cliff, the Engineer (and their employees, agents, and representatives) for any and all loss and/or damage arising out of the performance of this Contract. Said contractual coverage shall be absolute and not dependent upon any question of the negligence of the Contractor (and its employees, agents, and representatives), except however, that the Contractor shall not be held liable when an occurrence results solely from the negligence of the Village of Sea Cliff or the Engineer.

The certificate of insurance shall be written to provide that the Village receive at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of any cancellations or of any restrictive amendments and shall not contain exculpatory language for failure to give such notice. Both policies and the certificate of insurance shall name both the Village and the Engineer as additional named insured on the policies.

Construction of railing shall be done in accordance with the specifications and the plans, and in reasonably close conformity with the lines and grades shown on the plans or established by the Engineer.

Contractor to provide all labor, material, equipment, related services, and supervision required, including, but not limited to, manufacturing, fabrication, hot dipped galvanization, and installation for galvanized railings as required for the complete performance of the work, and as shown on the Drawings and as herein specified.

- C. Thermal Movements: Handrails and railings shall allow for movements resulting from 120 degree F (49 degree C) changes in ambient and 180 degree F (82 degree C) surface temperatures.
- D. Corrosion Resistance: All components to be hot dipped galvanized.

1.7 Quality Assurance

- Manufacturer Qualifications: Manufacturer shall be a firm engaged in the manufacture of handrails and railings of types and sizes required, and whose products have been in satisfactory use in similar service for a minimum of 10 years with local project experience including transportation and park projects. Contractor to provide five (5) similar projects completed within the last five (5) years.
- 2. Installer Qualifications: Installer shall be a firm that shall have a minimum of five years of successful installation experience with projects utilizing Galvanized handrails and railings similar in type and scope to that required for this Project.
- B. Regulatory Requirements: Comply with applicable requirements of the laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations of Federal, State, and local authorities having jurisdiction.
- C. Mock-Ups: Prior to installation of the work, fabricate and erect mock-ups for each type of finish and application required to verify selections made under sample submittals and to demonstrate aesthetic effects as well as qualities of materials and execution. F. Grout and Anchoring Cement:

 Non-Shrink, Non-Metallic Grout: Provide factory-packaged, non-staining, noncorrosive, non-gaseous grout complying with ASTM C1107. Provide grout specifically recommended by manufacturer for interior and exterior applications.

2.3 Fabrication

A. Assemble galvanized railings in shop to greatest extent possible to minimize field

splicing and assembly. Disassemble units only as necessary for shipping and handling limitations. Clearly mark units for reassembly and coordinated installation. Use connections that maintain structural value of joined pieces.

- B. Form changes in direction of railing members as shown on the Drawings.
- C. Fabricate railings by connecting members with railing manufacturer's standard concealed mechanical fasteners and fittings, unless otherwise indicated. Fabricate members and fittings to produce flush, smooth, rigid, hairline joints.
- D. Provide pre-manufactured or shop fabricated post installed anchors from galvanized material, brackets, flanges, miscellaneous fittings, and anchors to connect handrail and railing members to other pre-existing construction. Two (2) types of 'existing' anchors exist; side mount anchor into existing timber bulkhead (rim joist) and flush concrete install.
- E. Provide inserts and other anchorage devices to connect handrails and railings to concrete or masonry. Fabricate anchorage devices capable of withstanding loads imposed by handrails and railings. Coordinate anchorage devices with supporting structure.
- F. Shear and punch metals cleanly and accurately. Remove burrs from exposed cut edges.
- G. Cut, reinforce, drill, and tap components as indicated on the Drawings to receive finish hardware, screws, and similar items.
- H. Close exposed ends of railing members with prefabricated end fittings.
- Provide mounted handrail wall returns at wall ends unless otherwise indicated. Close ends of returns, unless clearance between end of railing and wall is 1/4 inch (6 mm) or less.

2.4 Finishes

- A. Galvanized Handrails and Railings: Hot-dip galvanize exterior handrails and railings to comply with ASTM A 123.
- B. Galvanizing: Hot-dip galvanize items as indicated to comply with applicable standard listed below:
 - 1. ASTM A 123, for galvanizing steel and iron products.
 - 2. ASTM A 153/A 153M, for galvanizing steel and iron hardware.
- C. Fill vent and drain holes that will be exposed in finished Work, unless indicated to remain as weep holes, by plugging with zinc solder and filing off smooth.
- D. For galvanized handrails and railings, provide galvanized fittings, brackets, fasteners, sleeves, and other ferrous components.

PART 3 - EXECUTION

3.1 Examination

- A. Verification of Conditions: Examine areas and conditions under which the work is to be installed, and notify the Owner in writing, with a copy to the Engineer, of any conditions detrimental to the proper and timely completion of the work. Do not proceed with the work until unsatisfactory conditions have been corrected.
 - 1. Examine substrates to receive anchors verifying that locations of concealed reinforcements have been clearly marked for the Installer. Locate reinforcements and mark locations if not already done.
 - 2. Beginning of the work shall indicate acceptance of the areas and conditions as satisfactory by the Installer.

3.2 Preparation

A. Coordinate setting drawings, diagrams, templates, instructions, and directions for installing anchors, such as sleeves, concrete inserts, anchor bolts, and miscellaneous items having integral anchors that are to be embedded in concrete construction. Coordinate delivery of such items to the Project site.

3.3 Installation

A. General:

- 1. Fitting: Fit exposed connections together to form tight, hairline joints.
- Cutting and Placement: Set handrails and railings accurately in location, alignment, and elevation measured from established lines and levels and free from rack.
 - a. Do not weld, cut, or abrade coated or finished surfaces of railing components that are intended for field connection by mechanical or other means without further cutting or fitting.
 - b. Align rails so variations from level or parallel alignment do not exceed 1/4 inch in 12 feet (1.6 mm per m).
 - c. Provide manufacturer's proprietary system to evacuate entrapped water in hollow sections of railing members that are exposed to exterior or to moisture from condensation or other sources, in order to prevent water from entering the concrete slab. In lieu of the manufacturer's proprietary system, if acceptable to the Engineer, provide another means to evacuate the entrapped water, i.e., a weephole and epoxy fill system ("drill-and-fill").
 - d. Anchor posts in concrete with pipe sleeves preset and anchored into concrete. After posts have been inserted into sleeves, solidly fill annular space between post and sleeve with non-metallic, non-shrink grout, mixed and placed to comply

with anchoring material manufacturer's directions.

- e. Anchor posts in concrete by forming or core drilling holes not less than 5 inches (127 mm) deep and 3/4 inch (19 mm) greater than outside diameter of post. Clean holes of loose material, insert posts, and fill annular space between post and concrete with non-metallic, non-shrink grout, mixed and placed to comply with anchoring material manufacturer's directions.
 - Cover anchorage joint with a round steel flange attached to post by set screws.
- 3. Corrosion Protection: Provide separation as recommended by manufacturer on concealed surfaces of Galvanized that will be in contact with grout, concrete, masonry, wood, or dissimilar metals.
- Adjusting: Adjust handrails and railings before anchoring to ensure alignment at abutting joint's space posts at interval indicated, but not less than required to achieve structural loads.
- 5. Fastening to In-Place Construction: Use anchorage devices and fasteners where necessary for securing handrails and railings and for properly transferring loads to in-place construction.
- B. Non-Welded Railings Connections: Use mechanical joints for permanently connecting railing components. Use wood blocks and padding to prevent damage to railing members and fittings.
- C. Installing Glass Panels in Glass Handrails and Railings: Install assembly to comply with railing manufacturer's written instructions. Attach base channel to building structure, then insert and connect factory-fabricated and factory-assembled glass panels.
 - 1. Erect glass handrails and railings under direct supervision of manufacturer's authorized technical personnel.

3.4 Adjusting and Cleaning

- A. Touch-Up Painting: Immediately after erection, clean field welds, bolted connections, and abraded areas of shop paint, and appoint exposed areas with same material.
- B. Cleaning: Restore finishes damaged during installation and construction period so no evidence remains of correction work. Return items that cannot be refinished in field to shop; make required alterations and refinish entire unit, or provide new units.

3.5 Protection

A. Provide final protection and maintain conditions in a manner acceptable to the Installer that shall ensure that the Galvanized handrails and railings shall be without damage at time of Substantial Completion.

B. Protect finishes of handrails and railings from damage during construction period with temporary protective coverings approved by railing manufacturer. Remove protective coverings at the time of Substantial Completion.
